The Importance of Fatherhood

This time of year I find that I often reflect on my dad. His life was marked by the gospel, and he lived sharing that hope with the least of these. Though he wasn't perfect, he was a good dad who loved the Lord and encouraged his children to do the same. Sadly, I cannot say that for everyone. Many of the individuals I meet with don't have the same experience with their father. Several have broken relationships, scarred by the effects of sin. Erickson's story of fatherhood is one example of many that I have heard over the years. The best part is, there is hope. When we trust in our heavenly Father, our lives are transformed for good. No matter our experience with our earthly father, our heavenly Father makes us new. Erickson's life is a testimony to that truth.

At a young age, Erickson made a profession of faith; however, his growth as a believer was stagnant. While having a loving father, he was raised in a home with



worldly values. Erickson was taught to find fulfillment and happiness in wealth and possessions. He then carried this mentality into his adult life. Focusing on worldly values, he put off the things of the Spirit such as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Instead, his life was wavering and unreliable. Then he became a father. For the first seven years of his son's life, Erickson continued to put off surrendering to Christ and pursued the things of this world. Erickson said, "Being raised to live with worldly values distorted my view of what being a father to my son looked like. I was a father who was present but not active in my son's life. I was encouraging and guiding him in the ways of this world, focusing on monetary wealth and possessions to validate his worth."

Erickson's choices led him to a life raging with sin and despair. It wasn't until Erickson came to The Lighthouse for help that he began to surrender his life to Christ. After completing the Anchored program, Erickson stated, "The Lighthouse helped me become a man who obeys my Savior. Having an intimate relationship with Him and His Word has transformed me into a more Christ-like father to my son." Erickson has actively taken on a new role in his son's life. Seeking to live like Christ, being led by the Spirit and guided by the Word of God, Erickson is thankful for the opportunity and desire to raise his son in the image and life of Christ, not the world.
